What is the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)?

- The EYFS is the stage of education for children from birth to the age of five
- It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play

There are 4 themes which underpin the EYFS

- **A unique Child-** Observe what a child is learning
- **Positive Relationships-** What adults can do
- **Enabling Environments** - What adults could provide
- **Learning and developing** - Children's achievements through the above

Areas of learning

There are 7 areas of learning which are split into:

The Prime Areas which are:

1. Personal, Social and Emotional Development
2. Communication and Language
3. Physical Development

Four Specific Areas

4. Literacy;
5. Mathematics;
6. Understanding the world;
7. Expressive arts and design

Examples of maths activities

- objects and numbers are hidden in the sand for the children to dig out and count and sort
 - hook a duck - children hook a duck and say the number which is on the bottom
 - the children choose a number and go and find that amount of objects

You can help your child by ...

- Sharing books, talking about the pictures
- Reading Book - make comments in their diary
- Read/share books at least 3 times a week
- Ongoing - encourage mark making, shopping lists etc.
- Encourage your child to talk
- Practise counting at any time - climbing the stairs, shopping etc
- Play simple board games
- Sing number rhymes and songs together
- Support any homework that comes home, sounds and number work
