To communicate geographically

Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to:

- key physical features, including: beach, coast, forest, hill, mountain, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation and weather
- key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office and shop
- Use compass directions (north, south, east and west) and locational language (e.g. near and far) to describe the location of features and routes on a map
- Devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key. Use simple grid references (A1, B1)
